The U.S.-ASEAN Institute for Rising Leaders Fellowship, announced by the **White House** in conjunction with the May 2022 ASEAN-U.S. Special Summit, will bring up to 30 **mid-career public** service professionals from **ASEAN countries** to the **Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies** (SAIS) in Washington for a **four-week leadership development program** beginning in August 2023.

Fellows will receive training in **leadership** and **decision-making**, and will participate in programs that deepen their understanding of key international issues such as **energy**, **emerging technologies**, **public health**, and **security**. The program will consist of classroom and extracurricular activities to help rising leaders develop these skills, drawing on faculty from Johns Hopkins SAIS and other divisions of the university, and distinguished thought leaders from the public and private sectors.

Who can participate?

Participants should be high-achieving mid-career officials. Suitable nominees will generally have at least 10 years of government service, public policy advocacy, non-governmental organization management, or similar experience; and will have demonstrated a track record of leadership, with experience working on issues that relate to regional or global policy challenges. The program is open to officials from any ministry or organization. Participants must be proficient in spoken and written English.





How will Fellows be selected?

For the inaugural year of this program, Johns Hopkins SAIS is pleased to partner with the ASEAN Committee in Washington (ACW), which will work with member states to nominate candidates for the fellowship. Johns Hopkins SAIS will then convene a selection committee to determine the final cohort. At least one Fellow may be selected from the ASEAN Secretariat.

How can I nominate a candidate for this Fellowship?

Governments and other interested parties are encouraged to engage with the ASEAN member country missions in Washington no later than May 1, 2023, to recommend suitable candidates for this Fellowship. As the selection committee seeks to build a cohort that reflects ASEAN's diversity, recommendations of outstanding female candidates or those from underrepresented communities are particularly encouraged.

When does the program begin?

The first U.S.-ASEAN Institute for Rising Leaders Fellowship cohort will come to Washington, DC in August 2023. With the generous support of private donors, Johns Hopkins SAIS will cover the costs of the program for selected candidates, as well as follow-on alumni opportunities.

U.S.-ASEAN Institute for Rising Leaders Fellowship

Program Background

At the ASEAN–U.S. Special Summit in May 2022, the White House announced that the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS) in Washington will host a newly-created U.S.-ASEAN Institute for Rising Leaders Fellowship. Starting in the summer of 2023, this Fellowship will bring up to 30 mid-career public service professionals—up to three from each of the 10 ASEAN countries and one from the ASEAN Secretariat—to Johns Hopkins SAIS annually for a four-week leadership development program. Our goal is for the first cohort to come to Washington in August 2023.

The program will focus on strengthening leadership, decision-making, and communications skills, as well as building Fellows' understanding of contemporary international issues such as energy, emerging technologies, public health, and security. Rising Leader Fellows will have the opportunity to learn about U.S. approaches to these issues, as well as U.S. views on the Indo-pacific—through interactions with faculty, thought leaders in the public and private sector, and experts on U.S. engagement in the region. They will also discuss U.S. models and best practices in public management while building leadership capacity in areas such as citizen engagement and resource management.

Johns Hopkins SAIS will develop this comprehensive program, including an advisory board comprised of academic, foreign-policy, nonprofit, and private-sector leaders from the United States and Southeast Asia to achieve this objective. We hope that a rotating member of the ASEAN Committee in Washington (ACW) will also consider joining the board. The program will consist of classroom and extracurricular activities to help mid-career leaders develop these skills, drawing on faculty from SAIS and other divisions of the university, and experts from the policy community. SAIS will also develop a robust alumni program for the Rising Leader Fellows network, which is anticipated to include online events and offerings, as well as occasional alumni meetings and engagements in Southeast Asia.

With the generous support of private donors, Johns Hopkins SAIS will cover the costs of the program for selected candidates, as well as follow-on alumni opportunities. Through a public-private partnership, the U.S. Department of State will offer support for the program.

Qualification Criteria

Participants should be high-achieving mid-career officials. Suitable nominees will generally have at least 10 years of government service, public policy advocacy, non-governmental organization management, or similar experience; and have demonstrated an established track record of leadership, with experience working on issues that relate to regional or global policy challenges.

(Participants could also include high-achieving representatives with similar experience from public policy advocacy or non-governmental organizations who may aspire to join government or re-join government.)

Participants must be proficient in spoken and written English.

Selection Process

For the first cohort in 2023, Johns Hopkins SAIS requests the ACW's partnership to help ensure that ASEAN member states have a role in the selection process. Specifically, Johns Hopkins SAIS requests that the ACW coordinate with ASEAN member governments to nominate five (5) candidates from each country for the fellowship. At least two (2) of the candidates must be women. Each of the candidates must belong to a different ministry or agency. Candidates from semi-autonomous entities, such as central banks, are also welcomed. For future cohorts, SAIS will work with the ASEAN Secretariat to further institutionalize the program under ASEAN processes.

ASEAN member governments are encouraged to nominate candidates who reflect ASEAN's diversity (with regard to gender, religion, ethnicity, etc.). Candidates who have professional experience relating to one or more of the four topical areas that will likely be given particular attention in the 2023 program curriculum—emerging technologies, energy and environment, public health, and security—should be given particular consideration.

For the 2023 cohort, ACW is also requested to nominate two (2) candidates from the ASEAN Secretariat, at least one (1) of which must be a woman.

After ASEAN member governments identify candidates, they will provide those candidates with the attached Application Form. A complete application includes the Application Form, a résumé or CV, and one or two letters of recommendation.

The candidates will submit the applications to Johns Hopkins SAIS at sais-asean-leaders@jhu.edu. The deadline for these submissions is May 1, 2023.

Johns Hopkins SAIS will convene and chair a selection committee composed of faculty and regional experts and will draw on input from the ACW and the U.S. Department of State. The committee will ensure that the applicants meet the established selection criteria and will shape the composition of the final cohort. The committee retains the discretion to select applicants who do not strictly fulfil all of the criteria but who have the potential to succeed in this Fellowship and make meaningful contributions to ASEAN and the U.S.-ASEAN relationship; or applicants who were invited to apply for the fellowship by members of the committee.

The selection committee will finalize the list of participants by May 15, 2023.

The program begins in Washington on Monday, July 31, 2023.



Background

This Fellowship Programme will offer advanced training in conflict analysis, negotiation and mediation to international and national civil servants to deepen knowledge and strengthen skills in these areas. The programme will be based on the latest knowledge, with the primary focus on preventing and resolving international disputes through the United Nations.

The programme will be available to *senior* and *middle level* professional staff from the substantive departments and agencies of the United Nations, staff from regional and sub regional organizations and diplomatic staff from foreign ministries around the world.

Sponsored by the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR), the programme will draw on the expertise of the Institute, as well as that of a number of distinguished and expert faculty from both academic and applied settings, including current and former UN Secretariat staff. As an autonomous organ of the United Nations, UNITAR has had extensive experience in the training of diplomats in multilateral diplomacy, negotiation, human rights, economic and social development and peace missions. The course content is described below.

Conceptual Background - Understanding and Analyzing International Disputes and Their Resolution

Participants will be provided with a comprehensive framework for understanding how disputes begin, escalate, and are resolved. This will include a systematic overview of the nature and causes of conflict, different types of conflict, the process of conflict escalation, the various transformations that occur during escalation, and the process of conflict de-escalation.

Different kinds of negotiation and mediation will be reviewed, as well as the various stages, multiple levels, and common obstacles to negotiation and mediation. Particular attention will be given to early detection of disputes and to the type of information required to provide sound political analyses and options for conflict prevention. The UN's ability to function as a dispute settlement system and the limitations and constraints of the international system, as it is currently constructed, will also be discussed.

The UN Secretary-General has stated that the *top priority* of the Organization is the prevention of violent conflict through the identification of political solutions that address root causes in order to achieve sustainable peace.

Applying Conflict Resolution to Real-life International Conflicts

The case study used for the negotiation simulation is based on a real conflict situation. The mediation case study reflects common challenges and dynamics in violent conflict contexts. Senior practitioners will share their strategies and lessons in peacemaking and inclusive processes. These will serve as the basis for extensive discussion of the issues, obstacles and problems which occur in real-life international dispute resolution.

Skills Training - Practicing International Dispute Resolution

This part of the programme is designed to build on the conceptual framework described above by providing hands-on practice in the skills needed to carry out effective preventive diplomacy and peacemaking. Negotiating skills will be practiced through exercises, simulations, role-playing and feedback. Participants will receive extensive practice in the skills needed for negotiation, including listening and summarizing; identifying and reformulating issues, positions and interests; creating and combining options; searching for principles or precedents upon which to base solutions; controlling emotions; and managing unfair negotiation tactics.

Participants will also be given practice in third party mediation. Through role-playing, Fellows will learn how to set procedural rules; enhance cooperation and trust between the parties; determine interests; create and package innovative options; maintain control over the proceedings; and draft agreements. Strategies, techniques and issues will be highlighted and discussed during debriefing sessions.

This is the thirtieth year of the Fellowship Programme in Peacemaking and Preventive Diplomacy. The last twenty-nine programmes have been highly successful with excellent evaluations from participating officials. The 2023 UNITAR Fellowship Programme in Peacemaking and Preventive Diplomacy will be held in the Oslo area, Norway from 27 June to 6 July 2023.

In selecting candidates for the programme, preference is given to mid and senior level diplomatic staff who have a commitment to the area and who can use this knowledge in policy making and/or implementation to benefit their country, their region or the international community. As a rule, preference is also given to more senior candidates. Further, the programme is focused on peacemaking and preventive diplomacy as described in the brochure, and does not focus on peacekeeping.

It is UNITAR policy to provide equity in training opportunities, including equal opportunity for women. Nominations of female applicants are encouraged.

Application and nomination forms are attached with the brochure. Applications and all supplementary material must be received by 8 May 2023. Approximately 40 Fellows will be selected from among the candidates. For those selected, the Programme Budget will cover the cost of tuition for the 2023 UNITAR Fellowship Programme in Peacemaking and Preventive Diplomacy.
