Government organizations in charge of legal and judicial system development, and universities

4. Background/Outline

The development and functioning of legal and judicial systems are foundations for people to live abundantly with ease of mind, and also represent the core elements of nation-building.

For autonomous and sustainable development of legal sector, it is crucial to have core human resources who are able to, for example, carry out comparative study of laws and reflect the results in legal system of their own countries.

This training will be beneficial for the target countries to develop a pool of human resources who can be future leaders for sustainable development of the legal sector.

5. Objectives

(1) Overall Goal

To help improve the legal and judicial systems in order to enhance the basis for effective, efficient and stable economic and social activities, and thereby support social and economic development.

(2) Project Purpose

Participants of the Long-term Program are expected:

-To enhance the capacity for improving legal and judicial systems through Doctor's course in Japanese Universities

(3) Outputs

- 1 Knowledge about Japanese laws is acquired.
- 2 Capacity to conduct comparative study of laws including Japanese laws is acquired.
- 3 Capacity to propose and apply the results of the comparative studies is acquired.
- 4 Participants complete all the requirements to obtain the set degree within the given period of time

6. Project Site

7. Activities including the contents of program, Target Organization / Group

(1) Contents of program

- Participants enroll in degree program offered by Japanese universities

(2) Target Organization / Group

Competent public officials in legal and judicial ministries/institutions with Master's degree
Competent researchers specializing in legal and judicial system development in public universities or public research institutions.

(To be selected as an accepted participant of degree programs, the candidate must pass the selection by a Japanese University, and must be approved by the respective government and JICA.)

8. Inputs

(1) Input from the Government of Japan

- Tuition and necessary expenses for degree program offered by Japanese universities
- Living allowance for Participants
- A round-trip airfare
- Cost for short-term program proposed by Japanese universities

(2) Input from the Recipient Government

9. Implementation Period

From September 2020 to September 2023

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Nagoya University Asian Satellite Campuses Institute

The Transnational Doctoral Program for Leading Professionals in Asian Countries is a distance education initiative, built upon the Nagoya University Graduate School of Law's fifteen-year experience with human resource development in support of legal and judicial reform in Asian countries. The program now has students studying law and political science from Cambodia, Laos, Mongolia, Uzbekistan and Vietnam.

The program is tailored to the needs of officials in the legislative, administrative and judicial sectors, as well as university faculty in the fields of law and political science in a country where the Graduate School of Law (GSL) is operating through ASCI.

Eligible candidates are expected to have at least three years of work experience in a relevant field or position, and wish to pursue an LL.D. through GSL.

Eligible candidates are also expected to hold a master's level degree from a recognized institution and demonstrate that they can conduct doctoral level research in the English language.

Admitted candidates will carry out their research and dissertation work in their home countries, while continuing to fulfill their work commitments.

The Transnational Doctoral Program for Leading Professionals in Asian Countries aims to create specialists in law and political science equipped with a high degree of practical ability, using their research skills cultivated at the masters level and refining their degree of specialization. LL.D. - Degree of Doctor of Laws (Comparative Law)

In order to graduate, the student is expected to have spent three years in the LL.D. program. The student must also submit a doctoral thesis in English after receiving the necessary supervision in doctoral research, as well as pass an examination of the submitted dissertation by their supervisory panel.

The faculty members are highly specialized and respected academics in various fields of law and political science.

I OUTLINE

1. Objectives

The "Transnational Doctoral Programs for Leading Professionals in Asian Countries" aims to offer doctoral degrees to government executives or individuals serving in equivalent leading positions of Asian countries who possess a master's degree in law or in political science, or the equivalent degree. The Program provides a combined education at Nagoya University (NU) Asian Satellite Campuses Institute (ASCI) conducted in collaboration with NU's main campus and short-term intensive academic activities at the main campus in Japan enabling students to continue their carrier in the current posts while deepening their knowledge and experience.

2. Eligible Applicants and Countries

Eligible applicants: Early government executives, faculty members of university, international organization executives or individuals serving in equivalent leading positions with at least three years of work experience. Applicants must be both nationals of and residents in the countries below:

Cambodia, Laos, Mongolia, Vietnam and Uzbekistan

3. Host University

Graduate School of Law (GSL), Nagoya University,

4. Maximum Number of Students Admitted

There are several openings for students in the program each year. The number of openings is determined each year by GSL based on the number and quality of applications and the availability of appropriate supervisors.

(3) Main Features

- The program is designed for students who are capable of carrying out research on an independent basis.
- The student is expected to visit his/her respective local satellite office regularly, where they will be able to consult with local academic staff and access research resources and facilities. Access to video conferencing facilities is available at the local satellite offices for communicating with the GSL academic staff.
- The student will be assigned one academic advisor and two sub-advisors from among the GSL faculty members to provide supervision and advice on research methodology, research progress, development of the argument, and completion of the thesis.
- As a general rule, the advisor will travel to the student's country once a year to provide intensive lectures on the relevant subject(s) to the student. There may be circumstances where the advisor's schedule will not allow such arrangements.
- Depending on the availability of the advisor and upon mutual agreement between student and advisor, the student will travel to Japan once (and possibly twice*) a year, to attend intensive seminars with his or her advisor and sub-advisors and to present an annual research progress presentation. These presentations will be open to the broader GSL faculty and will provide the student with an opportunity to receive comments and additional advisory input from other researchers and scholars.
- A highly qualified academic support-team in Japan will regularly engage with students via video conference and e-mail to assist in the development of academic skills and research design to help enable the student to complete his or her degree in close consultation with the advisors.

* If the advisor is unable to travel to the student's country for schooling, GSL will consider requests for a second visit by the student to Japan.

(4) Program Duration

For the completion of the Program, the student is expected to have spent three years in the LL.D. program and must submit a doctoral dissertation after receiving the necessary supervision for his/her doctoral research. In addition, the student is required to pass an examination of the submitted dissertation by their supervisory panel.

(5) Language

Lectures and other guidance are generally conducted in English. A doctoral dissertation shall be written in English. However, those who have completed a master's program in law or in political science, or the equivalent, in Japan with the submission of a certain length of Master's Thesis written in Japanese as partial fulfillment of its degree requirements may opt for writing a doctoral

6. Details of Curriculum

(1) Basic Concepts

The program aims to assist early-career professionals to develop specialized knowledge and skills while conducting original and innovative research in the areas of comparative law and political science. Through this program, we hope that students further their careers and play important leadership roles in their respective countries.

The program provides support to students through day-to-day research guidance both at the satellite offices and from Japan via videoconference and other distance learning tools. Intensive lectures, seminars, and research guidance sessions are also conducted both in the student's country and in Japan.

(2) Requirements for Doctoral Thesis

The doctoral thesis must meet the following criteria:

- Constitutes a contribution to the discovery and resolution of theoretical and practical problems in the areas of comparative law or political science.
- Uses mainly comparative law and comparative political science methods. In the case of international relations specialists, however, even concerning an analysis of the functioning of international documents and international institutions, it is permissible to consider the possible applications for domestic law and politics.
- Presents an analysis of relevant research trends and frames and argument on the basis of Japanese or English sources. This criterion applies where the thesis draws primarily on materials in the language of the home country of the student.
- States a research question, addressed in the thesis in a well-argued and well-structured manner.
- Shows originality in the progress of the research and comparisons.
- Answers anticipated criticisms in a methodologically sound manner.
